Sometimes, they give me insight into an event that will occur. The interesting thing about these dreams is that they always come from some energy force that is my grandma. Whether she is the one directly telling me the future in my dream or if she is signaling someone else to tell me the future, it's always through her.

Beyond these sleepy dreams (and nightmares as mine can often turn), I view my daydreams as just as important to my mood. Although I cannot focus my nighttime dreams, I am able to focus my daydreams. Create and manifest my goals and put my future aspiration dreams into the world. Whether they be a silly crush giving me attention or me landing a new exciting experience to challenge me, these dreams are my favorite.

As you reflect upon dreams tonight, I would like to share my dreams for this organization and LGBTQ folks in Ohio. I dream of a time when we aren't fighting stupid laws banning Drag performers or worried about talking about being gay in schools. I dream of a time when CGMC is seen throughout central Ohio and Columbus as for how brilliant of an organization we are. I dream that others recognize that we are the largest TTBB chorus in the state and one that far exceeds expectations of what a community chorus is able to achieve in a performance. Finally, I dream that CGMC is able to expand our mission and provide an ensemble for every LGBTQ-person who is interested in Choral Arts and what music can do for your soul. Whatever it is that you are dreaming, I say Dream On with your Sweet Dreams.

Welcome! This is a special season for the Columbus Gay Men's Chorus. CGMC was originally founded following a series of meetings in the living rooms of five gay men in 1990. That year, 51 men sang in the first ever CGMC concert. And now here we are, in our 34th season of song, serving as a pillar of inclusion and belonging for all queer people in Central Ohio and beyond with 150 singing members making up our three ensembles.

One of my favorite parts of my job is learning the stories of our community members. We have members who look forward to rehearsal every week because it is one of the few places they feel understood and can thrive. We have other members who came out later in life and have relied on the chorus as a foundation from which to grow. We have audience members who come to every show and give financially despite having no direct connection to anyone on stage, but are continually moved by our music and what we stand for. After leaving his dairy farm upbringing in his home state of Indiana, Brayton received a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance from The Ohio State University in 2006 and a Bachelor of Arts in sexualities studies in 2007, completing a thesis on *How Gay Male Bias Influences the Gender Performance of Drag Queens in and out of Drag.* After spending six amazing years in Columbus, Brayton completed his Master of Social Work at the University of Washington in Seattle in 2010, and received his Licensed Independent Clinical Social Work credentials in 2014.

After graduating in 2010, Brayton spent six years as the artistic director of Diverse Harmony, the nation's first queer straight alliance youth chorus, and Diverse Harmony's small a cappella ensemble Spectrum. Brayton left Seattle in 2017 to become the artistic director of Reveille Men's Chorus and Desert Voices Chorus in Tucson, AZ. Brayton completed his Master of Choral Conducting in 2020 from the University of Arizona. In 2022, Brayton spent six months as interim with NYCGMC in order to get the organization back on their feet during a difficult time.Brayton is very focused on community choral organizations. In 2019 he served on the board of the Arizona ACDA and is currently in his fourth year on the the board for GALA Choruses and serves as the committee chair for the Education and Networking committee. Brayton is honored and thankful to be in Columbus with CGMC as their artistic director. Being able to lead the innovative, resilient gem of GALA Choruses in the heart of the Midwest is a dream come true. Brayton is excited to continue raising voices and changing lives and looks forward to the amazing music that we will be creating.

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
